

CERTIFIED MAINTENANCE WORKMAN

Nature of work

The principal and customary work of the employee in this employment class consists in performing maintenance, repair and renovation work relevant to several building trades.

Required qualifications¹

Training or schooling and experience

To have a valid qualification certificate issued in compliance with the Regulation respecting the vocational training and qualification of manpower, covering electricians, pipe fitters, elevator mechanics and electrical machinery operators in sectors other than the construction industry (R.Q., c. F-5) and have two (2) years of pertinent experience in a variety of tasks relating to several other trades;

or

to have a valid journeyman competency certificate issued in compliance with the Regulation respecting the issuance of competency certificates (enacted in accordance with the Act respecting labour relations, vocational training and manpower management in the construction industry (R.S.Q., c. R-20)) and have two (2) years of pertinent experience in a variety of tasks relating to several other trades;

or

to have a diploma of vocational studies in an appropriate specialty and have three (3) years of pertinent experience.

Some characteristic duties

The employee in this employment class usually carries out his tasks in areas where it would be neither practical nor necessary to call upon specialized labour personnel. He performs general maintenance work such as repairs or renovations to buildings, sanitary installations and simple mechanical installations. He may also be called upon to carry out the preventive maintenance of equipment.

The certified maintenance workman may be called upon to co-ordinate the work of less experienced or non-specialized workmen.

If need be, he performs any other related tasks.

¹ Persons carrying out tasks pertaining to electricity or pipe mechanics must hold an appropriate and valid qualification certificate issued in compliance with the Regulation respecting the vocational training and qualification of manpower, covering electricians, pipe fitters, elevator mechanics and electrical machinery operators in sectors other than the construction industry (R.Q., c. F-5).
